6. Keeps working at something until it is finished
7. Is well liked by other children
8. Follows 1 & 2 step instructions from parents
9. Waits his or her turn in games
10. Over-reacts or has temper tantrums
11. Uses words rather than physical actions to settle arguments with other children
12. Admits mistakes and doesn't blame others
13. Asks permission to use something that belongs to someone else
14. Goes to bed easily and without a struggle
15. Describes others' feelings (such as happy, sad, mad)
